Music Summer Home Learning Assignment Instructions

Welcome to your Music Summer Home Learning assignment! This is an opportunity for you to create a PowerPoint presentation (or use another software of your choice) that will last between 2 - 5 minutes. Your goal is to showcase your understanding of music and share your personal musical interests with your classmates. Below is a set of detailed suggestions to help you complete this assignment successfully.

Presentation Features - 3 sections

1. The Elements of Music - MAD TSHIRTT

In this section, you will explore the fundamental elements of music represented by the acronym MAD TSHIRTT, as covered in our classes this year.

- Definition: What does MAD TSHIRTT stand for?
- **Key Vocabulary**: For each element, provide a clear definition and explanation. Here are some ideas for how to break it down:
 - o **M Melody**: Describe what melody is and why it is important in music.
 - A Articulation: Explain how articulation affects the way music is played or sung.
 - D Dynamics: Discuss the concept of dynamics and how it influences the emotional impact of a piece.
 - T Texture: Define texture in music and give examples of different textures.
 - S Structure: Talk about the structure of music and how it organizes a piece.
 - o **H Harmony**: Explain harmony and its role in creating depth in music.
 - I Instrumentation: Describe instrumentation and how different instruments contribute to a piece.
 - o **R Rhythm**: Discuss the importance of rhythm in music.
 - o **T Timbre**: Explain timbre and how it distinguishes different sounds.
 - o **T Tempo**: Define tempo and its effect on the feel of the music.

- **Give Examples**: For each element, provide specific examples from songs or pieces of music that illustrate these concepts. This could include mentioning well-known songs that highlight each element.
- **Bonus Sound Clips**: Enhance your presentation by including sound clips that demonstrate musical features such as **crescendo** (a gradual increase in loudness) or **Tertiary form** (a specific structure in music). Make sure to explain what the audience should listen for in each clip.

2. Your Favourite Music

In this section, you will share your personal musical interests.

- **Choose Your Focus**: Select a specific genre, artist, album, or song that resonates with you. Be sure to choose something you are passionate about!
- Background Information: Provide some history about your choice. This could include the artist's background, the genre's origins, or the album's release context.
- **Personal Connection**: Explain why this music is your favourite. What emotions does it evoke? How has it impacted your life or your experiences?
- Examples: Mention popular songs or instruments associated with your choice.
- **Cultural Context**: Describe the cultural origins and influences of the music. How does it reflect the society or time period it comes from?
- **Genre Classification**: Identify the genre of your choice and discuss its characteristics.

3. You as a Musician

In this section, you will reflect on your own musical journey.

- **Looking Forward**: Share what you are excited about for the upcoming year in music. Are there specific goals you want to achieve or experiences you hope to have?

Presentation Style

To make your presentation engaging and visually appealing, consider the following tips:

- **Visual Appeal**: Use colourful slides with images and graphics that relate to your content. This will help keep your audience's attention.
- **Musical Elements**: Incorporate background music and sound clips throughout your presentation. This will enhance the experience and provide a richer understanding of the concepts you are discussing.
- **Engagement**: Keep your audience interested by asking questions or sharing fun facts related to your topic. This interaction can make your presentation more memorable.
